Professor of Medieval and Modern Church History – W3

to commence on **September 1, 2025**.

The Faculty is looking for an individual capable of making innovative teaching and research contributions of fundamental academic importance in the fields of medieval and modern church history. The successful candidate will hold a relevant doctorate in Catholic theology and a *Habilitation* or equivalent qualification. The position requires the ability to conduct both research and teaching across the full breadth of the subject area. Some of the teaching involved with the post is to be provided within the scope of the teaching degrees run as part of the cooperation agreement with the University of Cologne. The successful candidate will also be required to teach in English on the faculty's planned master's degree program of Comparative Theology. Candidates are expected to have excellent didactic skills and a passion for teaching. The selected candidate will be required to participate in the design and implementation of faculty and university-based research projects. In particular, they will be expected to engage actively with the research theme of "Ambiguities—Identities—Designs of Meaning" both within the faculty and the Transdisciplinary Research Areas of the University of Bonn. Desirable qualifications are experience in the acquisition of third-party funding and international research cooperation. Participation in academic administration will also be expected.

Conditions of employment are in accordance with § 36 HG NRW.
